Digraphs

A digraph is a combination of two letters that make one sound. Consonant digraphs are sounds with two consonants working together. This book practices some of the most common consonant digraphs.

Here are some actions to use as you read the book:

SH: hold your finger to lips, shhhhh

CH: chop the side of your hand into the palm of your other hand

TH (unvoiced like thumb and three): thumbs up

TH (voiced like there and the): point into the distance

PH: pinky and thumb out, hold fist up to your ear like a phone

NG: move arms like a conductor, sign language for music

WH: hands palm up, shrugging shoulders

CK: tick your finger around in a circle like the hands of a clock

KN: point to the ground, commanding to kneel

WR: hold an imaginary pencil and write in the air

GH: make muscles
